

Shelter Spotlight: Shelter Chain



Maybe you visited the shelter in 2019 and noticed the ever growing and colorful construction paper chain strung along the walls. Or maybe you

attended the Bow Wow Boogie in March and gasped in awe when our shelter manager, Elaine, had staff and board members strech out the chain from almost one side of the Ramkota Convention Center to the other. The

reason for awe and surprise is that the chain represents all the animals we helped in 2019. Each link in the chain represents an animal and each color represents the month in which those animals were adopted out. Over the course of a year we helped over 400 animals who would have otherwise been homeless. This includes dogs, cats, hamsters, guinea pigs, rats, ferrets, rabbits, birds, chickens (yep, we said chickens), snakes, turtles, and fish that were all adopted out into loving homes in 2019! It's a reminder that our service is not a want but a NEED for Aberdeen and the many surrounding communities. People rely on us to help these animals when no one else can. But we aren't just helping animals. We touch over 400 people's lives by helping them find their best friend and the love and devotion only a shelter pet can provide.

New Building Campaign

We are well into our capital fund campaign for the new builidng and we are proud to announce we have raised right around \$400,000! aahsboard1200@gmail.com. The total project cost for a new 7,400 square foot building is \$1,000,000. The proposed layout will be optimized for traffic flow and operational efficiency. The dog area will feature kennels with indoor and outdoor access to provide more exercise space, fresh air and a less stressful environment. The cat area will be expanded and an open cat sanctuary will allow cats more area to play, roam, and interact with adopters. Medical isolation will be added to help to prevent the spread of illness. Finally, the new layout will have more rooms designated for adopters to have time with animals, volunteer training, board meetings, public education programs and more!

COVID-19

Unfortunately, the COVID-19 pandemic has affected all if us in one way or another. At the AAHS, we only have four full time staff members, so it is imperative that we keep our humans healthy so they can keep the animals safe. We also care about the health and safety or our adopters and volunteers! Therefore, on March 15th we went to an appointment only visitor model. We are still adopting out pets and taking in surrenders and strays. However, the appointment only system allows our staff to limit the number of people in our small facility at any one time and allows them to wipe down surfaces in-between visits. This will continue until further notice. With the ever-changing situation we encourage people to check back frequently. We also encourage people to check the Center for Disease Control website on human and animal safety during COVID-19 and other illnesses.

NEED For a New Shelter

Preventing disease spread is a part of life for us at the AAHS. Just like humans, our pets can contract and spread very contagious viruses between their likekinds (luckily human and domestic pet viruses rarely transfer from one to the other). This means we are REALLY good at cleaning and we do our best to "social distance" or isolate animals from one another when they are sick. In reality, we should be set up just like a hospital. Special entrances for intakes, especially if we are unsure of vaccination history, and isolation or intensive care units for those who are being treated. All surfaces in the building should be able to be disinfected. Unfortunately, due to how the AAHS building has gradually grown

over the years the current shelter is a patchwork of additions and does not allow us to protect all pets from illness. We have had several instances where we have had to quarantine off entire rooms or wings of the building due to virus and bacteria outbreaks. Most recently we had to close down an entire cat room for TWO MONTHS due to a very contagious kitty virus called feline panleukopenia. We had to pull everything out of the room, throw away what couldn't be disinfected and disinfect EVERYTHING before it was put back in. A big shout out to **Budget Furniture** for providing a new couch for the cat room afterwards! We tell you all this so you can see just how much we NEED a new building. For the safety of our pets, we NEED to make this happen. Additionally, besides the health concerns, the building itself is having major structural issues. Every time we turn around something else is breaking or falling apart. If you have not donated yet, please consider donating now.
