

Shelter Spotlight: Endowment Fund

In a previous issue of News Bites we featured the generous life of animal lover, Cindy Koerner. We also mentioned the endowment fund that was going to be set up in her name. Now, officially known as the Cynthia Koerner Endowment For Shelter Animals Fund we have a path toward perpetual revenue for the Aberdeen Area Humane Society. This fund is maintained by the South Daokta Community Foundation (SDCF) and it is an invested pool of money that provides a reliable source of income in perpetuity. The endowment fund does not replace our annual fundraising endeavors, but it does provide an additional source of income that we know we can count on annually and forever. We were also able to apply, qualify for and receive a \$20,000 challenge grant through the SDCF which is money specifically designed to help non-profits kick-start their endowments. Anyone interested

can make a donation to the the Cynthia Koerner Endowment For Shelter Animals Fund, to the Aberdeen Area Humane Society Designated Fund, or start a fund in your own name. As a donor you have the option to designate how funds are spent if you so choose. One of the unique aspects of donations to endowments are that they survive beyond the lives of their givers, creating true legacies. While in the near term we will still need the regular revenue from our members and fundraisers to ensure operating cash for today's expenses, the endowment funds ensure our organization can provide services long into the future. We are serious about planning for the future in a diversified way, because we expect to be around helping animals for a very long time!! Hot Weather Pet Safety Tips

The dog (and cat) days of summer are here! Make sure you are properly caring for you pets during the hot humid days! Always have a cool place with ample water for your pet. Bring them inside whenever possible on hot days. Never leave your pets in a parked car. Not even for a minute! Not even with the car running and air conditioner on. Temperatures inside a vehicle can rise rapidly to dangerous levels. Limit exercise. Adjust intensity and duration of exercise in accordance with the temperature. On very hot days, limit exercise to early morning or evening hours. Always carry water with you to keep your dog from dehydrating. Be

aware of hot asphalt. Being so close to the ground, your pooch's body can heat up quickly, and sensitive paw pads can burn. Watch for signs of heatstroke. Symptoms are heavy panting, glazed eyes, a rapid heartbeat, difficulty breathing, lack of coordination, vomiting, seizure and unconsciousness. Animals are at particular risk for heat stroke if they are very old, very young, overweight, not conditioned to prolonged exercise, or have heart or respiratory disease. Some breeds of dogs will have a much harder time breathing in extreme heat. If you suspect your pet is suffering from heatstroke move your pet into the shade or an air-conditioned area. Apply cold towels to their head, neck and chest or run cool (not cold) water over them. Let them drink small amounts of cool water. Take them directly to a veterinarian.
